Targeted to students in middle school, supporting the study of literature, science, social studies, and history

Browse categories & Topic Pages

The categories and topics featured in *Research in Context* are arranged into nine categories (topics may appear in more than one category). Each Topic Page will include an overview explaining the importance of the topic, examining controversies, and pointing out areas for focused research.

Topic pages may also include **biographies**, **streaming video**, **images**, and **audio** from reputable research sources, plus:

- **primary sources:** excerpts from transcripts of interviews, legislative acts, resolutions, speeches, testimonials, treaties and more.
- **creative works:** short stories, poems and plays.
- **news, magazines:** articles from over 390 English-language international sources.

Search

Besides a Basic Search box, *Research In Context* provides an Advanced Search that combines criteria such as keyword, document title, publication title, author, subject, entire document, person, place name, name of work, and more. You can limit search results in several ways, including Lexile reading level. If you limit by Lexile reading level your results will only contain magazines, news, and audio.
