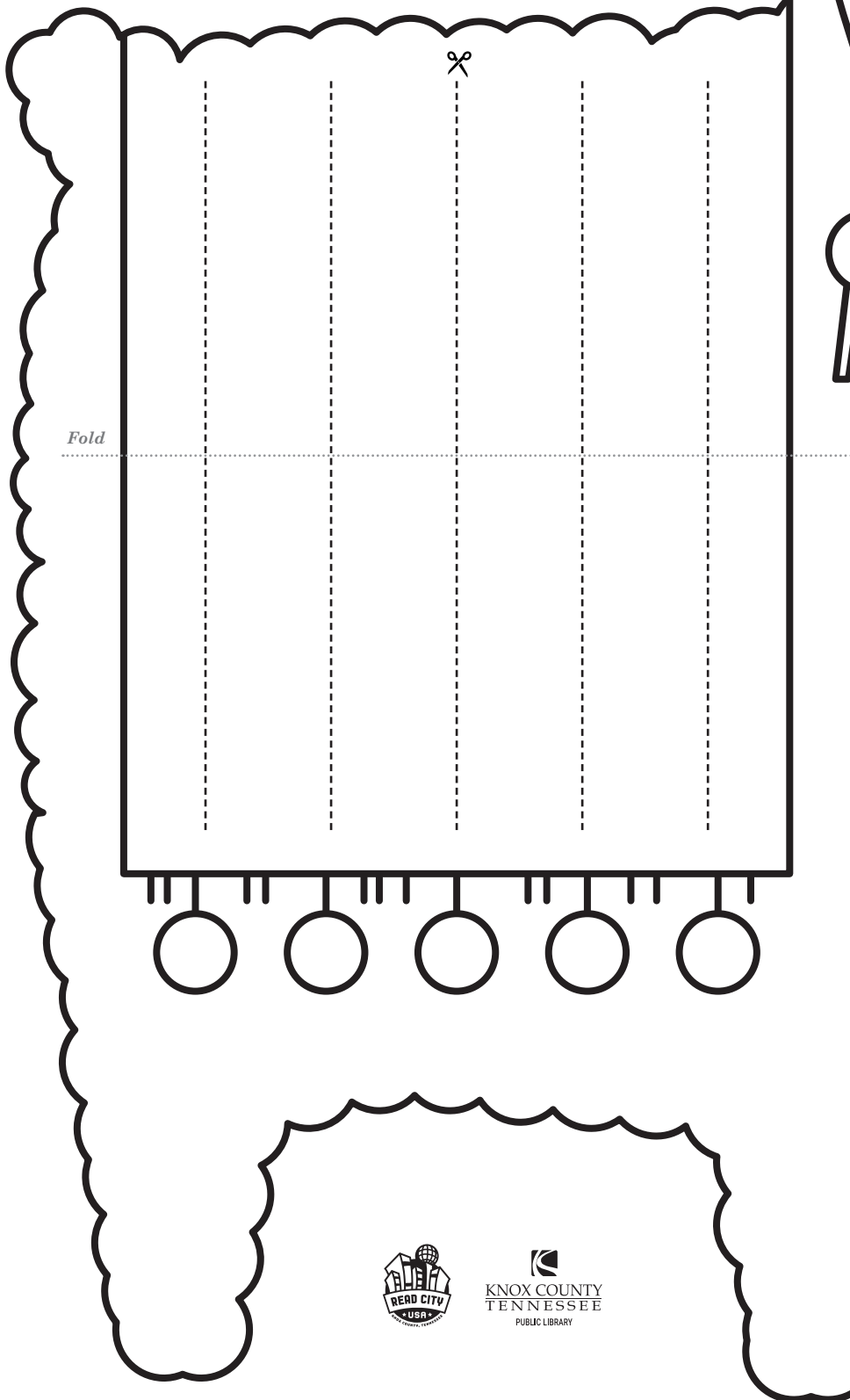
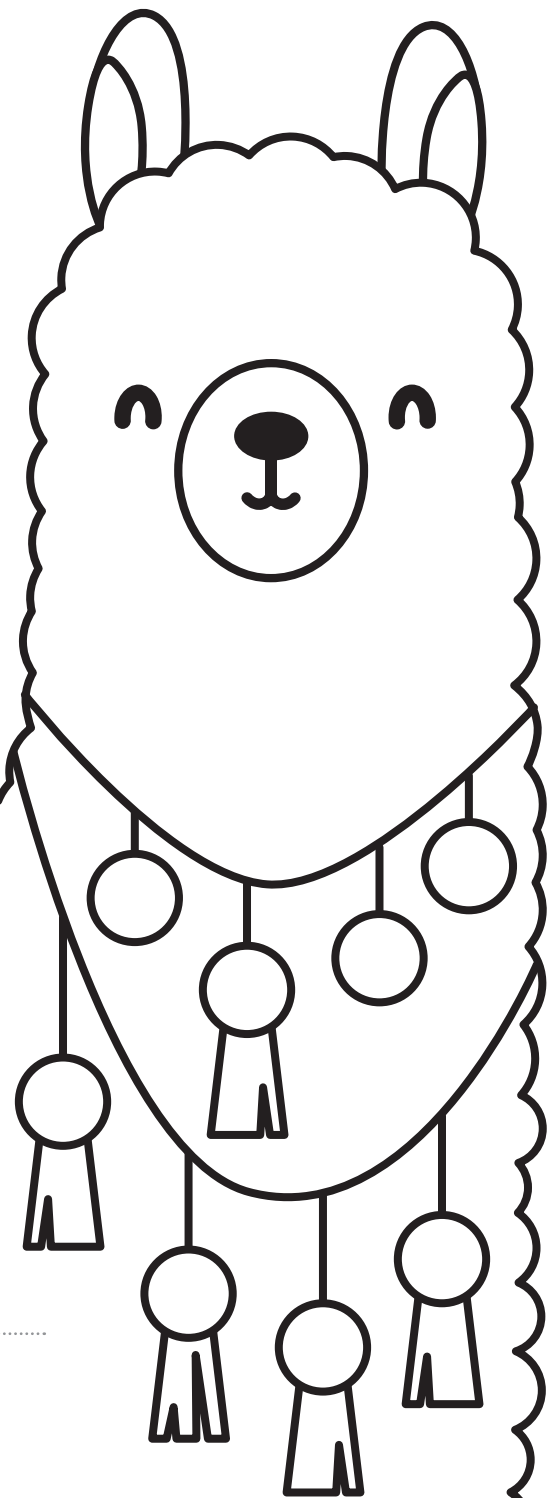


# Llama Blanket Weaving Craft

# Llama Blanket Weaving Craft

Weave a blanket for Llama!

- 1.) Color or decorate your llama and weaving strips.
  - 2.) Cut out the strips.
  - 3.) Cut along the dashed lines on the blanket. *Hint: Fold along the gray dotted line, then cut from the fold in the middle to the end of the dashed line. Unfold.*
  - 4.) Weave one strip of paper at a time into the blanket by going *over* then *under* the lines you cut until you reach the end.
  - 5.) Start a new strip directly under the first, going first *under* then *over*.
- Repeat steps 4-5 with remaining strips.

Advanced options:

Cut additional lines closer together.

Try weaving different materials, such as thin strips of colorful paper or ribbons.

Try weaving different patterns (over 2, under 1, etc.)
